## Who should attend the Access Tucson Summer Session?

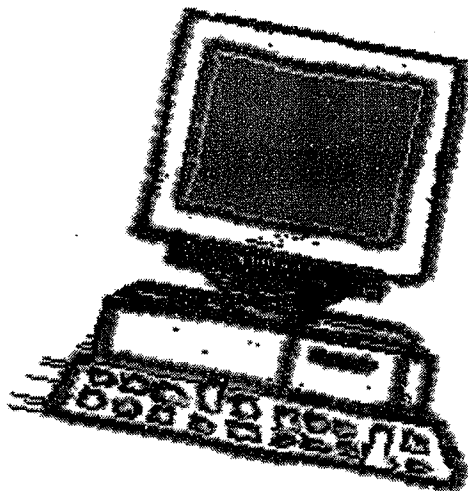
This special program offers skill building for young people ages 9 and up. No prior experience in media is necessary. The Summer Session production classes will be challenging for both beginners and experienced producers.

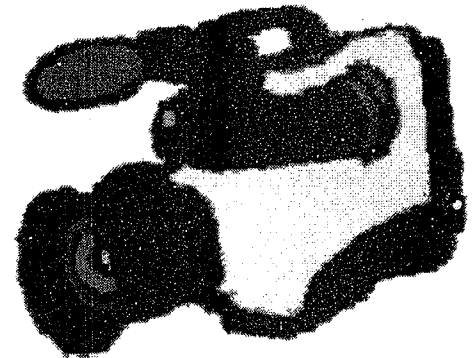
## Television Production

Access Tucson has a summer program that offers kids a chance to explore the world of television production. From scripting and shooting, to performing as talent on the set, Summer Session participants learn to create their own television programs.

Through creating their own messages, children are no longer simple consumers of television, but programmers.
